Homeowner Improvement Program

We are excited to announce a matching grant program to help FPNA homeowners offset the costs of exterior home projects. Thanks to a partnership with NeighborLink Fort Wayne, all residents may apply reimbursement funding through the Homeowner Improvement

Program (HIP).

NeighborLink

HIP is formatted as a split cost

program that reimburses \$0.50 of every \$1 of homeowner contribution,

Matching grants are available on a first come, first served basis for eligible projects and as long as funds are available.



up to a maximum grant amount of \$300.

The Foster Park Neighborhood has a total of \$3,000 available for HIP grants.

Recipients must provide before and after photos, meet

applicable program deadlines, and provide receipts or invoices to receive reimbursement from NeighborLink Fort Wayne.

Eligible projects must enhance or improve some portion of the home's street-facing exterior. **Example projects include**, **but are not limited to:**

- Exterior painting
- Porch repair or installation
- Landscaping/tree planting
- Front door updates
- Siding repair or replacement
- Window repair or replacement
- Roof repair or replacement
- Tree pruning or removal
- Garage door upgrades
- Flower box installation
- Masonry work
- Exterior lighting upgrades

Online applications for HIP grants will be accepted on the FPNA website beginning **Monday**, **August 3rd**.

The Packard Area Planning Alliance (PAPA) is collaborating with the City of Fort Wayne's Community Development Division to develop the New Packard Area Plan. Once completed, this plan will serve as a blueprint for the future within the 18 neighborhoods included in the PAPA boundaries.

We are asking for feedback from area residents to help guide this planning process. This is a critical stage to ensure the new Plan includes the right priorities and goals.

INN Updates

In August 2019, the Southwest Area Partnership (SWAP) established a steering committee to determine how to allocate newly available funds from the Investing in Neighborhoods Now (INN) program. Each quadrant was granted \$500,000 to invest in smaller projects that will have a lasting impact in our community.

The steering committee has regularly met and solicited feedback from a wide variety of stakeholders from the southwest quadrant. Many ideas and proposals were submitted. In the coming weeks and months, the steering committee will be finalizing the package of investments, as directed by input from area neighborhoods, and outlining the next steps for implementation of the most popular choices. Stay tuned for future updates.

A lot has been happening at nearby Quimby Village. In July, Crescendo Coffee & More opened for business. This new coffee shop is part of an expansion project for the adjacent Club Room at The Clyde.

The Crescendo menu features a variety of coffee drinks, ice cream, desserts, donuts, and sandwiches, among other offerings.

The last few years have seen a welcomed investment at Quimby Village, spurred by the renovation of The Clyde Theatre.

Intersection Updates

After several months of living with the intersection closure at Old Mill & Rudisill, the end of construction is in sight. On a phone call in late July, City Utilities shared that the project was on schedule for a full reopening of the intersection in September 2020.



While this will return some normalcy to our commutes, it does also mean that traffic on Old Mill will return to previous levels. The Association is in talks with the City to ensure that measures are taken to keep drivers and pedestrians safe when the intersection reopens.
