Mural Coming to Foster Park

Those who walk the loop at Foster Park are probably familiar with the pedestrian suspension bridge across the St. Mary's. Earlier this summer, a group of residents worked with Fort Wayne Parks &

Recreation and the Park Foundation to develop a mural concept for the southern base of the bridge. The goal was to bring positive attention to this hidden gem, bring new public art to our area, and deter graffiti.

Local artist Suzi Rhee, a resident of the nearby Fairmont Neighborhood, developed the design and will be finishing up the painting within the month of September. Many thanks to several Foster Park Neighborhood residents who donated financial gifts to support this project. Half of the project's cost was raised in a 48-hour period through contributions from area residents and neighborhoods.

Summit to Relocate Solar Panels

The Summit is in the design stage of relocating its solar panel array from the previous roofmounted location to a ground-mounted location (shown in the image to the right). This proposed change was recently approved, with conditions, by the

Here are a few helpful and timely reminders to help keep our neighborhood happy and safe for all residents.

Safe Driving | Please drive carefully and watch for pedestrians, especially when backing out of driveways. Schools are back in session so many more children walking to and from home, schools, and bus stops. Always stop by school buses when the stop arm is out and pay extra attention when driving near schools and bus stops.

Leaf Pickup | The City of Fort Wayne provides leaf pickup services from October through December. This includes two rounds of curbside leaf pickup and on-demand bagged leaf pickup via 311. Keep an eye on our Facebook page this fall for updates about leaf pickup services.

Pet Cleanup | Please make sure to clean up after your dog(s) when taking them on walks throughout the neighborhood.

Firepits | The use of firepits is permitted but subject to various safety conditions listed on the Fire Department's website. Please reference those conditions to ensure compliance and take common sense steps to keep your backyard fires safe and controlled.

STREET TREE UPDATE

Our association began making investments in our street tree infrastructure in 2017. This fall/winter, another 15 trees will be planted along our streets (for a total of over 60 new trees planted in recent years). Planting locations were identified and marked (with white flags) earlier this year. Trees typically get planted by the City between October and December.

Residents who have new trees planted in front of their homes are encouraged to support the tree's growth by watering them regularly for the first couple growing seasons. Contact Kody Tinnel with any questions about street tree planting or pruning.

As a reminder, renting is not allowed within the Foster Park Neighborhood Association boundaries without board approval (per our Restrictive Covenants, as amended in 2005).
