#### **Bluffton Road Bridge Project**

Fort Wayne Public Works hosted a public meeting this past February regarding the upcoming Bluffton Road Bridge rehabilitation project. A detailed summary of the proposed changes, including visuals, is posted in the News section of our association website. The

# Revised Library Proposal Includes Expanded Shawnee Branch

In recent months, the Allen County Public Library (ACPL) conducted a series of public input activities in pursuit of

feedback on two proposed Facility Master Plan options. Both of the initially proposed options would have resulted in the closure of the nearby Shawnee Branch with services then shifting to other branches on the south side of town that would be renovated.

The current branch building poses numerous maintenance and ADA issues, so it made sense to no longer use that specific facility. However, public input from area residents was strongly opposed to losing a library branch near the current Shawnee Branch location (close to Bishop Luers). The ACPL Board heard that feedback and adjusted the plan to include a new Shawnee Branch location very near the existing site. ## **City Requesting Feedback for Potential Improvements to Foster Park Golf Course**

Fort Wayne Parks and Recreation will host two public meetings to gather input on upgrades and improvements to the Foster Park Golf Course. The meeting dates are Thursday, April 21 and Thursday, May 19. Both will begin at 6pm and take place at the Sears Pavilion [1701 Bluffton Road].

More specifically, Parks leaders are hoping to learn more about what users would prefer to see, including amenities, practice facilities, and landscaping, among other elements. Make sure to attend one or both of these meetings if you have opinions on the future of this important nearby amenity.

#### NEW VOTING LOCATION

In previous elections, residents of our neighborhood voted at Lester's Banquet Hall on Bluffton Road.

Starting with the May 3, 2022 primary election, our precinct will now be voting at the Sears Pavilion, across Bluffton Road from The Clyde. Early in-person voting and mail-in absentee ballot options are also available.

#### **Summer Reminders**

With summer just around the corner, here are a few helpful reminders to ensure we all have a safe and enjoyable season.

**Safe Driving** | Please drive carefully and watch for pedestrians, especially when backing out of driveways.

**Tall Grass** | Please keep your lawn mowed below 9 inches to ensure compliance with Fort Wayne's tall grass ordinance.

**Fireworks** | Per local and state laws, fireworks may only be discharged on certain dates and times (see City website for details). Please be courteous to neighbors who may have pets or family members who do not react well to the sounds and lights from fireworks.

**Pet Cleanup** | Please make sure to clean up after your dog(s) when taking them on walks throughout the neighborhood.

**Firepits** | The use of firepits is permitted but subject to various safety conditions listed on the Fire Department's website. Please reference those conditions to ensure compliance and take common sense steps to keep your backyard fires safe and controlled.

**Security** | We encourage all residents to take basic steps to reduce your likelihood of being targeted by a criminal. Plenty of helpful resources are available on the Fort Wayne Police Department's website.

#### STREET TREE CARE

Over the past few years, our neighborhood streets have gained nearly 60 new street trees. To ensure they grow to full maturity, please take a few steps to support the health of these young trees.



- Water | This is the most important element of caring for newer trees, especially during the summer. Water at least once a week in the hot, dry months to promote stronger roots.
- Mulch | Spread a 2-inch layer of natural mulch under the drip line of the tree. This helps maintain soil moisture, prevent weeds, and prevent possible damage from lawn equipment. Avoid piling excessive mulch around the base of the trunk.

#### **Dumpster Day Returns**

Thanks to a program through the City of Fort Wayne, neighborhood residents will have the opportunity to dispose of unwanted solid waste at no cost to homeowners or the association.

When | Saturday, June 11th 8am-12pm



**Where** | The dumpster will be placed on Kimmel Drive, the small street connecting the west ends of Foster and Sheridan.

**How It Works** | Simply gather any unwanted trash (see list below for unacceptable materials) and drop it in the dumpster during the hours noted above.

Please **do not overfill** the dumpster. It will not be picked up if improperly filled. Container space will be available on a first come, first served basis so plan accordingly if you have items to dispose.

#### **Unacceptable Materials**

The following materials **CAN NOT** be placed in the dumpster:

Anti-freeze Fire Extinguishers Radioactive Materials
Auto Parts Oil Based Paint Pesticides
Concrete Tires Appliances with Freon
Freon Refrigerant Liquids Closed Containers
Lead Acid Batteries Fertilizers Chemicals

Lead Acid Batteries Fertilizers Chemicals
Used Oil Auto Fluids Hazardous Waste
Explosives Compressed Gas Special Waste

Asphalt Fluorescent Bulbs Leaves

Electronics Herbicides Items Containing Mercury \*Latex paint cans need to be dried out before placing in the dumpster. They cannot accept paint in liquid form because it may leak onto the ground or street.
