Packard Park Progress

If you have driven down Fairfield recently, you may have noticed changes happening at Packard Park. Since the groundbreaking ceremony this past winter, crews have been working to transform this nearby neighborhood park into a revamped community asset. Once complete, amenities will include new accessible playgrounds, walking paths, new lighting, benches, event plaza space, flexible open space, and enhanced landscaping and trees throughout.

The Packard Area Planning Alliance (PAPA) was recently awarded a neighborhood engagement grant and will be hosting a special event later this year to celebrate the reopening of the revamped Packard Park. Stay tuned for details!

STREET TREES

Over the past few years, our neighborhood streets have gained over 70 new street trees. To ensure they grow to full maturity, please take a few steps to support the health of these young trees.



- Water | This is the most important element of caring for newer trees, especially during the summer. Water at least once a week in the hot, dry months to promote good tree health.
- Mulch | Spread a 2-inch layer of natural mulch under the drip line of the tree. This helps maintain soil moisture, prevent weeds, and prevent possible damage from lawn equipment. Avoid piling excessive mulch around the base of the trunk.

Foster Park Restoration

In August or September, Parks and Recreation is planning to release the final plans for the revamped Foster Park. The new plan is being developed following multiple public input opportunities. Based on the most recent round of input regarding a north or south entrance, we can confirm that any plans for a roundabout have been scrapped. Other details are yet to be announced. Stay tuned for more updates in the coming months. In the meantime, crews have been steadily restoring the construction site and hauling away equipment and materials, a welcome sign that the end of this long project is coming.

Bluffton Road Bridge

While inconvenient, the bridge project is making progress and is expected to continue through the spring or summer of 2026. The new southern half of the bridge deck is complete and now serving as the designated route for through traffic, though with major traffic flow modifications that cause congestion (through at least October). Motorists are encouraged to find alternate routes.

Warm Weather Season Reminders

As we all enjoy the warmer months, here are a few helpful reminders to ensure we all have a safe and enjoyable season.

Safe Driving | Please drive carefully and watch for pedestrians, especially when backing out of driveways.

Tall Grass | Please keep your lawn mowed below 9 inches to ensure compliance with Fort Wayne's tall grass ordinance.

Fireworks | Per local and state laws, fireworks may only be discharged on certain dates and times (see City website for details). Please be courteous to neighbors who may have pets or family members who do not react well to the sounds and lights from fireworks.

Pet Cleanup | Please make sure to clean up after your dog(s) when taking them on walks throughout the neighborhood.

Firepits | The use of firepits is permitted but subject to various safety conditions listed on the Fire Department's website. Please reference those conditions to ensure compliance and take common sense steps to keep your backyard fires safe and controlled.

Security | We encourage all residents to take basic steps to reduce your likelihood of being targeted by a criminal. Plenty of helpful resources are available on the Fort Wayne Police Department's website.

When In Doubt, Throw It Out



The City of Fort Wayne is continuing its campaign to educate residents about the right and wrong ways to recycle.

When non-recyclable items or dirty recyclables enter the waste stream, they cause problems for processing and minimize the resale value of the bulk materials.

For example, greasy pizza boxes, plastic bags, and plastic straws are items that should NOT be placed in the recycling bins.

When in doubt, throw it out is a smart approach if you are unsure whether an item can be properly recycled in your curbside bin.
